FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK Dear Parents and Carers.

I don't know about you, but I find it hard to believe that we are more than halfway through Term 3, but we are. Given what is ahead of us, it would seem like time is rushing us to the end of term.

RAISING FUNDS

You would be well aware that the key elements for raising general funds for the school are the Voluntary Contribution (\$60.00) that we ask parents to pay at the beginning of the year, and the Lap-a-thon in Term 2. The Parents and Citizens Association raises funds to support the school through Dollars for Scholars (helps pay for online programmes that children access at school and at home), Easter Egg raffle, Colour Blast Run and the end-of-year Disco. With the funds raised by the P&C we are replacing the carpet in Room 13, replacing the café blinds in the Kindergarten, putting in new bike racks, purchasing reading resources for upper primary and replacing some of the Winter Carnival sports uniforms. The P&C also has a Voluntary Fund Contribution of \$50.00 per family. Parents/Carers have asked if they are able to contribute more than the \$50. You will see some options in this area when you are sent the Contributions and Charges sheet for 2024. The most the school can ask for as a voluntary contribution is \$60, but parents/carers assembly where each class can contribute more if they choose to.

SCHOOL BOARD

The School Board has been working to produce the school's Business Plan 2023-25, which has now been all-but finalised. The Board is also looking into the prospect of having a crossing guard on Stockley Road. There is a specific process that must be followed in order to achieve this, and it can be a lengthy process.

MANAGER CORPORATE SERVICES

I would like to congratulate Mrs Joan Davies into the position of Manager Corporate Services in our school. Joan has been relieving in the position since Mrs Young left and now holds the position on a permanent basis. Joan is a welcome addition to the front office staff.

ATHLETICS TRAINING

As of this week, children are starting training for the Faction Athletics Carnival in Term 4. Years 1 and 2 students will train on Mondays from 1:00 to 2:00 pm and our Year 3 to 6 students will train on Fridays from 1:55 to 2:55 pm. We encourage the students

to wear their faction shirt on the training days - this helps get them in the team spirit!



BEBRAS CHALLENGE

Bebras is an international initiative aiming to promote Computer Science among school students at all ages. The Bebras Challenge is open twice a year to Australian Students in Years 3 - 12, and

engages students' computational thinking and problem solving skills in a fun, interactive environment. Our Year 3 and 4 students will again be involved in this on Tuesday, August 29th, the Year 5s on Thursday the 31st and the Year 6s on Tuesday September 5th.

PRINCIPALS' DAY

YSAFE LAUNCH AND NATIONAL DAY OF ACTION AGAINST BULLYING AND VIOLENCE (NDAABV)





Last Friday was the NDAABV. This day encourages school communities to work together to be proactive in implementing solutions to prevent and address bullying. This year's theme was: 'Growing Connections'. On the day Bunbury PS launched the ySafe Regional and Remote School Schools Digital Experts Academy (DX) at the school. Students from Years 3-6 have been using the program to develop further awareness of online safety in the world.

The DX is a specialised online, social and emotional learning program that equips students with crucial safeguarding skills for both online and offline contexts, optimising their overall wellbeing. It offers an array of benefits, including a curriculum-linked digital citizenship education, diverse learner pathways, evidence-based learning outcomes, and a gamified learning experience that ensures an enjoyable and engaging learning process for the students. The program provides an easy-to-implement process for tracking student progress, supporting teachers and schools in monitoring their students' growth and development in the online world.

Nola Marino and Don Punch together with ySafe representatives Patrick Thomas (ySafe Education and Engagement National Education Manager) and Tanya Wren (ySafe Education and Wellbeing, Director of Education) attended the event. YEAR 2 CLASS ASSEMBLY: SAFETY ON WHEELS



Emotion Coaching Your Child Bunbury
