#### STAFF CARPARK

I appreciate the respect that many parents/carers demonstrate by not using the staff carpark but it would appear that some parents/carers are confused about exactly what is the Staff Carpark as the sign can be misleading. This photo shows the Staff Carpark – it is **both the bitumen area and the grass area**.



The carpark is, of itself, safe. It is only when it is being misused that it presents danger to both children and vehicles. We can tell children again and again to not run through the carpark. But they will still do it – they are children. Parents/carers doing circuits through the carpark to pick up their child are misusing the facility. Parents/carers parking the carpark (either in the middle of it or in a bay) are also misusing the facility. Misuse puts children at risk. The photo shows plenty of parking spaces in the grass area, but this is not always the case. We also have some staff arriving between 2:30 and 3:00pm who who need to park. This is why it is called a Staff Carpark – it is not called a Visitors' Carpark, or a Parent/Carer Carpark or a Drive-through Child Pick-up Area.

Please, Please, Please, do not use the Staff Carpark.

#### **SPELLING BEE**


