




MAKING A DIFFERENCE AWARD

Our school was invited to participate in the STEM Showcase at the recent Resources Technology Showcase in Perth. As a result the Education Department Director-general, Ms Lisa Rogers, awarded our school one of her Making A Difference Awards for our "Outstanding contribution to the STEM Showcase at the Resources Technology Showcase for embracing STEM learning to solve real-life work problems and for preparing students for modern workplaces."





SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING CHALLENGE 2023

We had 32 children from the two Year 6 classes attend the University of Newcastle Science and Engineering Challenge Discovery Day last week.

This is a day-long competition that provides Year 6 students with a positive experience on applying their science and engineering skills to problem solve. Students competed in teams of 4 against other southwest schools and are awarded points for each activity. This year activities focussed on efficient network pathways to join towns by using the least amount of string. The aim of another activity was to build a power network that makes a profit by powering as many buildings as possible for as small a cost, with the students paying a price for the different length of leads used.

The school with the most cumulative points at the end of the day is declared Champion School. Our school performed really well and was declared Champion School.
